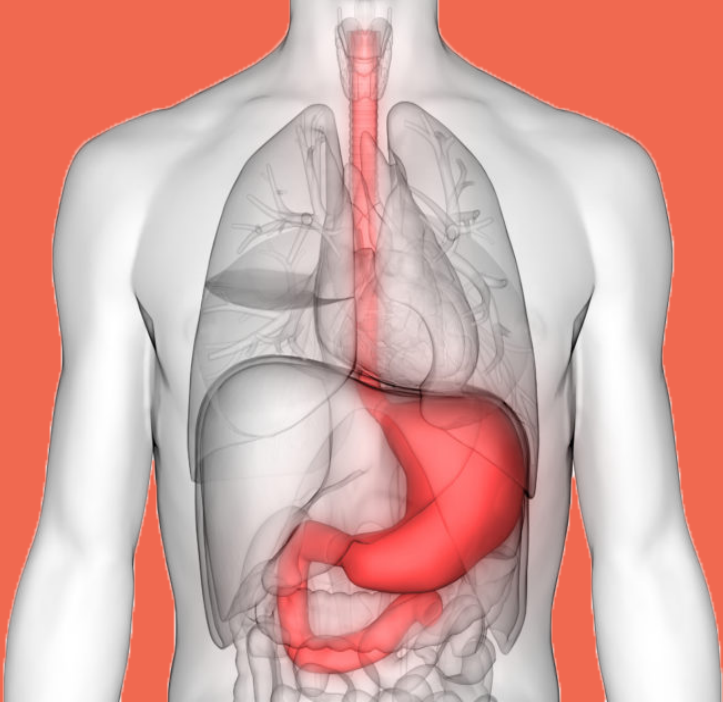


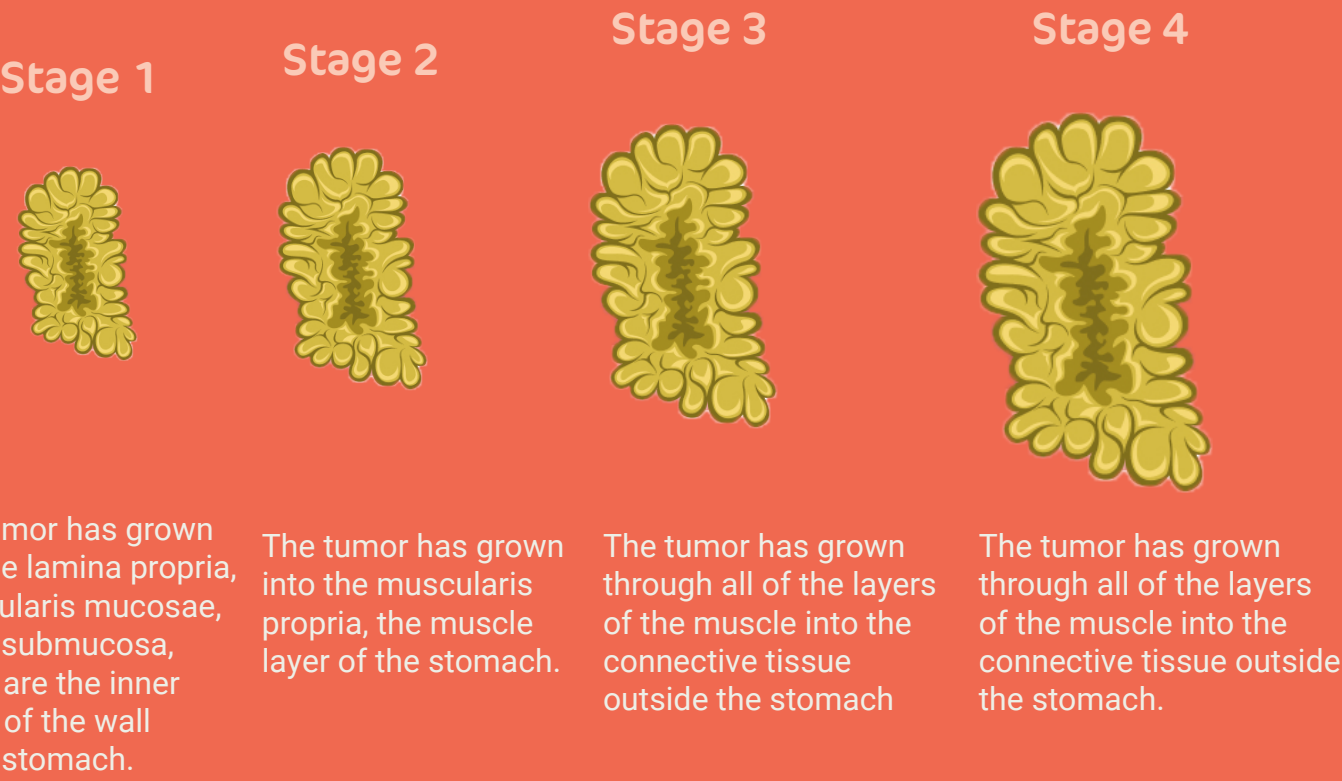
WHAT IS STOMACH CANCER?

STOMACH CANCER, ALSO CALLED GASTRIC CANCER, BEGINS WHEN CELLS IN THE STOMACH START TO GROW OUT OF CONTROL. IN 90 TO 95% OF CASES, THE DISEASE STARTS IN THE CELLS THAT FORM THE LINING OF THE STOMACH – BEGINNING AS AN ULCER OR POLYP.



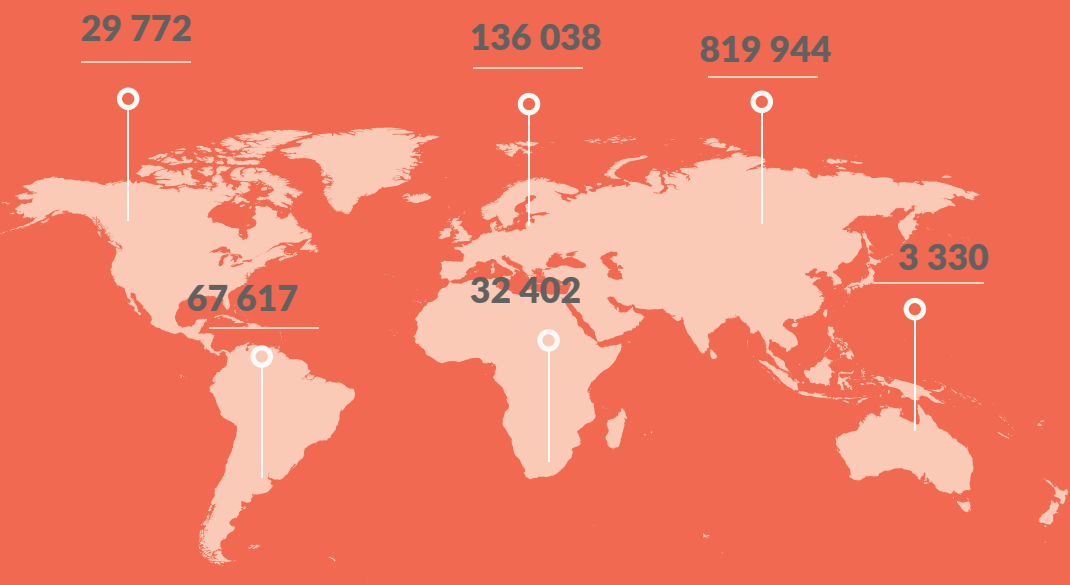

GASTRIC CANCER IS THE SECOND-LEADING CAUSE OF CANCER DEATHS WORLDWIDE

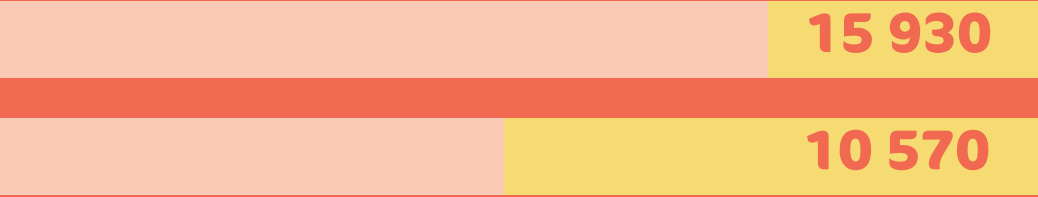
NUMBER OF NEW CASES IN 2020, BOTH SEXES, ALL AGES
