
My idea is to create a prototype for a website for learning the basic tools of the Graphic Design software and some basic information about the graphic design history, principles, topography and logo design.

## WHY:





I will start with lynda.com. I think this is one of the best place to learn more about the different software and develop new skills to improve your work.

Use to be around 400\$ but now is 20\$ a month.


lynda.com was acquired by LinkedIn in 2015 for **\$1.5 billion**, so now is part of the LinkedIn site.

This are some CDs from 10 years ago - that's how you could buy then some of the Lynda's courses .




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## 1. Udemy.com





Adobe began in 1982 with the founding of the company by Charles Geschke and John Warnock. They developed Adobe PostScript, which became the first international standard for computer printing.

The company is named after a place called Adobe Creek in Los Altos, California and its headquarter is located in San Jose, California.

In 2011 was created Adobe Creative Cloud. Before that there were couple versions but you needed it to buy them and installed them in your computer. You had them forever but when a new version comes up, you had to buy it because normally many things were different. So, the subscription model was a big change.

The Adobe logo was designed by John Warnock's wife - Marva. She was a graphic designer.

## InDesign


InDesign is very powerful tool used to create professional layouts for print and digital publishing.



## FIGMA

According HubSpot, Figma has grown tremendously over the past few years (around 77% of UI designers use it as their preferred design tool). It is expected to have a total market share of about \$16.5 billion by 2025.

Figma comes with many design tools that the developers need and makes work easier for remote teams. It is founded in 2012 by Evan Wallace and Dylan Field.

Figma was about to get bought by Adobe last year and join the family by replacing the Adobe XD but some legal issues arrived and the deal was off.

I think one of the reasons actually was that EU issued a statement saying that the deal shouldn't happen because this will give the green light to Adobe to have monopoly in the global market.

The big plus is that you can create free account and use it as long as you want.



According to Kathleen Maher “CorelDraw first shipped in 1989. It is one of the seminal software programs of the Windows era, which officially kicked off with the shipment of Windows 1.0 in 1985. At around the same time, Adobe introduced Illustrator (1987) and Photoshop (1988). During this peaceful pre-3D era, these three products turned the average personal computer into a professional tool for artists and photographers and helped kick off the demand for modern PC graphics for all computers—not just workstations and high-end machines. Graphics software got the ball rolling, and the game industry picked it up and kept running with it.

CorelDraw is actually a big box of software—or was, when there was such a thing as a box of software; now it's a big download. The CorelDraw X8 Suite now includes:

Photo-Paint for photo retouching and editing; Font Manager, the new module that organizes and provides access to fonts whether they're installed on the system or not; PowerTrace, a raster-to-vector conversion tool; Connect for access to outside resources for stock art and photos; Capture, a screen capture tool Corel offered years before anyone even heard of TechSmith's SnagIt or Windows Snipping Tool; and Corel WebSite Creator.”



CorelDraw now is available for Mac too. I bought it 6-7 years ago because one of teachers recommended it and then I found out with disappointment that is only for Windows.







**Create a background design**

To create the background, double-click the **Rectangle tool** on the left toolbar. Use the **Pick tool** to drag the top edge down to middle guideline.

Click a color swatch on the color palette to fill the rectangle with color; right-click the no-color swatch to remove the outline.

**Tip:** You can use the **Eyedropper tool** to sample a fill color from your photo.




To add more visual appeal, you can use the **Transparency tool** to add a pattern:

- Select the **Transparency tool**.

**Create a photo frame**


You can create a simple frame using one of the shape tools, such as **Rectangle**, **Ellipse**, **Polygon**, etc.

- Select the **Polygon tool** and on the property bar, set the number of sides to 15.
- Click and drag to draw a polygon (press the **Ctrl/Cmd** key while dragging to draw an even-sided polygon).
- Select the **Shape tool** and drag one of the inner nodes inward to create points.
- Use the **Pick tool** to resize, rotate, and move the polygon to the right side of the card.

In 2018, Procreate became the overall best selling iPad app.

Procreate is used for digital illustration, painting and animation. It is designed for iPad and iPhone. It offers a wide range of features and tools for artists of all levels, allowing them to create everything from sketches and paintings to complex illustrations and animations.

It provides a variety of brushes and tools for sketching, including pencils, inks, and charcoals. Procreate includes features for frame-by-frame animation, allowing users to create simple animations and storyboards.
